HOME SWEET HOME

Melba Courselle is back home safe and sound from the International Friendship Tour to Denmark and the Soviet Union. This is her story of her trip.

I was one of many who was privileged to accompany the "Angelettes" (dancers) on this tour.

My granddaughter, Tanya is one of the dancers of this group and they were definitely Ambassadors of Good Will.

Our first stop was Copenhagen. We saw Tivoli with all its beautiful colors, fountains and rides. Next day we boarded a ferry boat to Malmo, Sweden, then a train to Lund, then back to Copenhagen, where we toured "Town Square" which is surrounded by beautiful buildings. The Angelettes performed at both Tivoli and Town Square.

Our next stop was Leningrad. We went on a sightseeing tour, ending up at Childrens Theater, where we were entertained by a group of Russian 4 and 5 year olds doing a folk dance. The angelettes performed here also.

Next day we toured Hermitage Park, which is very large with a beautiful amphitheater in the center. The Angelettes performed. We saw Hermitage House where Peter the Great once lived. The rooms were elegant with chandeliers and art work which was breathtaking. We went through a beautiful cathedral with stained glass windows depicting scenes of the life of Christ. It was hard to believe that this Cathedral has never had a church service in it.

Our journey then took us to Moscow, which was much nicer and cleaner than Leningrad with its gorgeous buildings and parks. We saw the Olympic area, Red Square, the Kremlin and much more. Rode the Metro (Subway). The Metro stations were beautiful with marbled walls, muraled ceilings and gorgeous chandeliers. Saw Gorky Park which is much like our Valley Fair.

Our last stop was the Kosmos Hotel, a really swanky hotel with a big auditorium, swimming pool, bowling alley, the works. This also was the Angelettes last performance. At the finale of each of their performances throughout the tour they would walk into the audience singing "Sing for you, America" shaking hands with the foreigners. It was so impressive.



LAUNDRY NOTES

While doing my laundry this week-end, I watched a couple prepare to start the washing machine next to mine. The lady pushed the coin slot in very fast, out came the slide and....nothing. Now comes the ritual of flipping all the selector switches, opening and closing the lid, jiggling the coin slide, and of course a gentle pounding on the control box. Once this ceremony was completed, an "Out-of Order" sign was hung on the machine in remembrance of the lost 75¢ and the laundry was moved to another machine.

After they had left, I noticed another machine with the coin slot stuck in. With a little finesse, I was able to push the slide the rest of the way in and watched as the machine went through the cycles empty.

A man I know who owns and operates coin operated laundry machines once told me the most common reason machines do not work is simply because people push the coins into the machine much too fast. I have noticed people ramming the coins in so fast, it was as if they wanted to get the money in before the machines had time to realize what was happening. With that, the chances of the machine jamming or not starting are increased tremendously.

All it takes is a slow and easy push. If a coin is bent, you will meet resistance immediately instead of jamming the slide. It will also give all the mechanisms inside a chance to make contact. If the machine fails to start then, there is definitely a mechanical problem.

Try the slow and easy method next time. Although I may not be an expert on getting clean laundry, one thing I do know is how to start the machines.


